这个度假住宅位于新西兰繁忙都市芒格努伊山市的隐蔽场地，它隐藏在一个巨大的 pohutukawa 树下，附近是一些零星的保留下来的木屋。

设计的主要目标是创造出一个新的具备很大灵活性的住宅，同时保有现在家庭使用的当地木屋的那种简单、休闲的特性。

设计的主要方法是设计一个单一的卧室度假住宅，卧室与开阔起居空间朝着海洋和太阳敞开，设计还巧妙地融入了三个富余的小床，供客人居住。

通过设计，最后该度假住宅变成了一个拥有四个卧室的 135 平方米的矩形综合体，与周围住宅不同，这个度假住宅没有设置正门，其户外式客厅对外敞开，如同户外宿营一样，日常的生活体验因此变成了一种户外度假。

在室内家具以及材料的选择上，尤其注重简单和惬意、精致和环保因素的考虑。卧室内部采用的胶合板夹层与精密的滑动式铝制百叶窗形成鲜明对比。不仅为卧室带来了良好的采光和通风效果，同时确保了住户的隐私及安全。





Situated on a secluded site within the busy metropolis of Mt Maunganui, New Zealand, this holiday home is sheltered behind a magnificent pohutukawa tree and one of the last original beach cottages remaining along Mt Maunganui beach.



The key objective of the brief was to produce a new home that provided more space and greater flexibility for extended family holidays but was still reminiscent of the spirit and character of simple, relaxed, laid back holiday living. The primary approach was to design a single bedroom holiday home with a main bedroom and open plan living area orientated towards the ocean view and the sun. However, the design of the home also discretely provides three additional

sleeping areas for additional family.

The four bedroom holiday home was developed into a compact 135sq.m. rectangular plan. Unlike the surrounding homes, the design of this home is intentionally relaxed and holiday-like, there is no front entry, the living area is open to the outside, and like camping, experiences of everyday activities are connected to the outdoors.

Products and materials have been specifically chosen to reflect a simple

and relaxed, yet highly refined and sustainable home; for example, painted plywood cladding contrasts with sophisticated sliding aluminium louvre panels, used for private sleeping areas. When open, these panels provide light and connection to the outdoors, when closed the panels provide privacy from closely located neighbours, security when the home is vacant and secure passive ventilation to sleeping areas.
